

## Olmsted Park Features

- Ward's Pond: This secluded pond is a glacial "kettlehole" formed at the end of the last ice age. **17.** A serene, heavily wooded area, the visitor finds a quiet wilderness, steps from the surrounding city.
- Wildflower Meadow: Once the site of an indoor ice skating rink, the meadow now offers unique 18. habitat for butterflies, bees, and other pollinators.
- 19. Daisy Field: Olmsted originally designed this as a large meadow surrounded by woods. Today, playing fields serve community groups for little league, softball, soccer and touch football.
- Allerton Overlook: This semi-circular walk descends into the park and provides scenic views of the 20. banks and islands of Leverett Pond.
- 21. Leverett Pond: Leverett Pond is a fine example of Olmsted's skill combining landscape, water, and structure into his designs. Islands were created to provide both visual interest and waterfowl breeding area.
