

#### Visiting the Emerald Necklace

Park users should follow social distancing guidelines and adhere to recommendations from the Boston Parks and Recreation Department and the Centers for Disease Control (CDC).

- . Remain at least 6 feet away from other people
- · Wear a cloth face covering while outdoors
- . If the park is too crowded when you arrive, return at another time
- · Wash hands and/or utilize hand sanitizer before and after going outside
- . Do not congregate in groups or participate in group activities, including sports
- . Stay home if you feel sick







