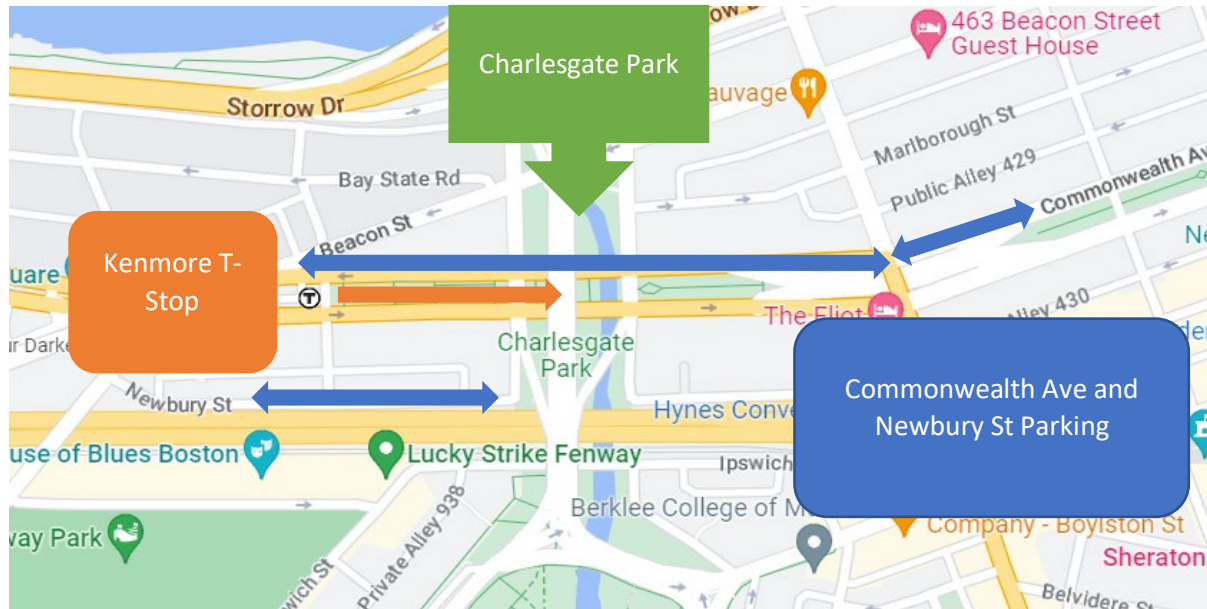


Lights in the Necklace

Transit and Parking Information

Charlesgate Park Trees

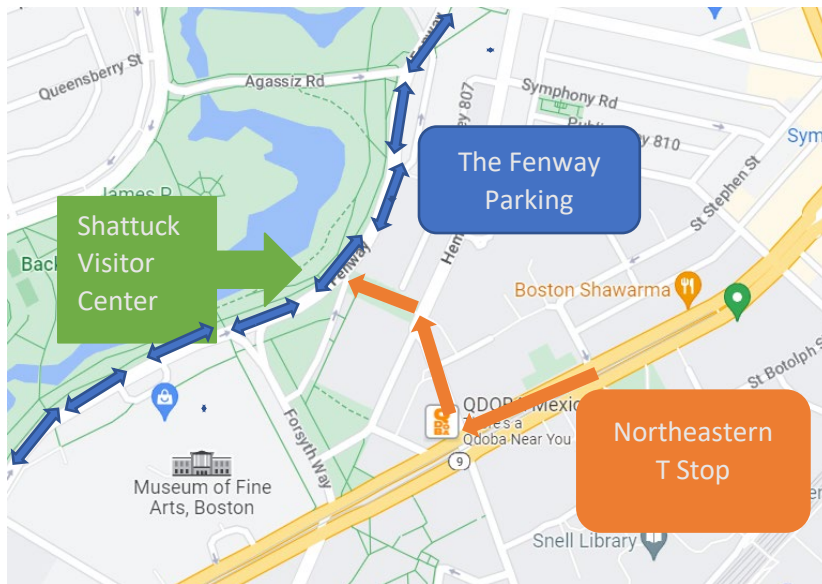
Visit by MBTA (walk from T stop: 0.2 miles, ~4 minutes): Take the Green Line to the Kenmore stop, walk 0.2 miles on Commonwealth Avenue towards Charlesgate W until you arrive at the park. The trees will be to your left.



Visit by car: There are metered parking spots along Commonwealth Avenue and Newbury Street.

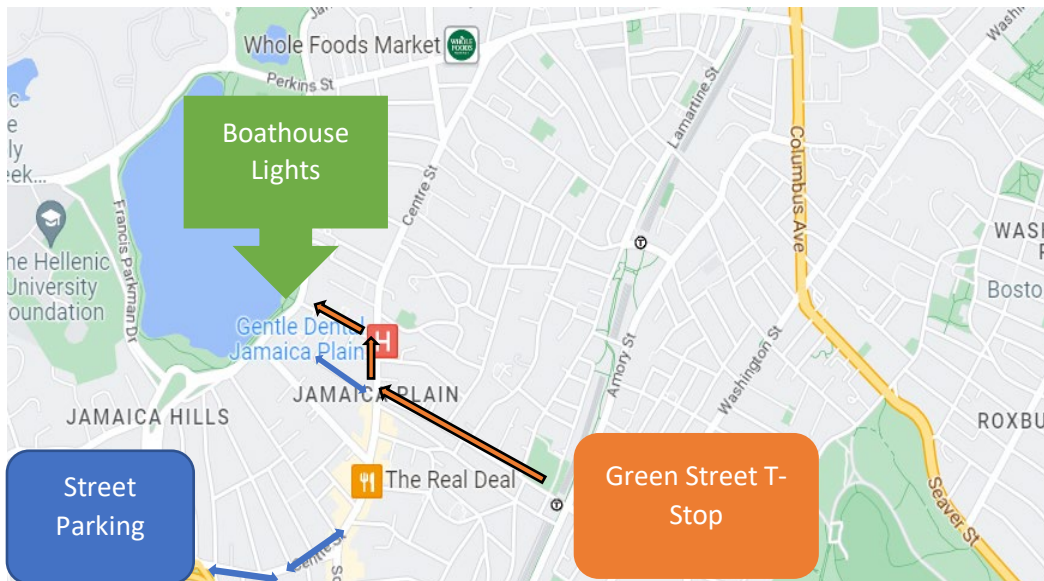
Shattuck Visitor Center

Visit by MBTA (walk from T stop: 0.2 miles, ~4 minutes): Take the Green Line E to the Northeastern Stop, turn right (southeast) on Huntington Avenue towards Forsyth Street. Take the crosswalk to your right and turn onto Forsyth Street. Walk 420 feet and then take the crosswalk across Hemingway Street. Take the pedestrian walkway ahead and walk 295 feet. Take the crosswalk over The Fenway and the Visitors Center and trees will be straight ahead.



Visit by car: There are metered parking spots available along The Fenway.

Jamaica Pond Boathouse



Visit by MBTA, option 1 (walk from T stop: 0.7 miles, ~14 minute walk): Take the Orange Line to the Green St stop. Head northwest 0.4 miles on Green Street toward Woolsey Square. Turn right onto Centre Street and walk for 0.1 miles, then turn left onto Pond Street. Walk 0.2 miles, then use the crosswalk to cross Jamaica Way. The Jamaica Pond Boathouse and the tree lights will be in front of you.

Visit by car: There is free/non-resident parking along Pond Street, Centre Street, Governor Road, or Myrtle Street, all of which is a short walk from the Boathouse.

Walnut Ave. Entrance



Visit by MBTA (0.7 miles, ~15 minute walk): Take the Orange Line to the Stony Brook stop. Head east on Boylston Street toward Amory Street for 0.1 miles. Then turn left on Dalrymple Street and take the stairs and proceed for 322 feet. Continue onto Mendell Way for 184 feet. Turn right onto School Street and walk 0.4 miles. Turn left onto Walnut Avenue and walk 390 feet. Take the cross walk to your right and proceed into Franklin Park.

Visit by car: There is parking along Walnut Avenue. (Parking within the park is closed at night.)
